Dear Reader,

Shortly before Christmas I realised that over the years I had inadvertently made a small collection of nativity sets. One of these is unique within the collection as it is pocket-sized. It was designed to be carried around. Whoever carries it carries the Holy Family. I was thinking of this when I visited the British Museum to see the 'Living with gods' exhibition, because a number of the exhibits were portable artefacts that religious believers would carry or wear as part of their religious practices.

The curator claims that there are over 4,000 religions in the world, engaging 85% of its population. A Hindu exhibit stopped me in my tracks. It was Nataraja, a depiction of the Hindu god Shiva as the Lord of the dance. Shiva Nataraja is the cosmic dancer who prepares for the creation of the universe. If you think that the modern world has left such gods behind and that we now live in a godless age, prepare to think again! For what brought me to a halt was the statement that a statue of Nataraja stands outside the CERN nuclear research station in Switzerland. Hardly anything in the world is more modern or futuristic than the laboratory, yet there is still space for religion.

The exhibition sets out to answer an intriguing question: "Are we homo sapiens or homo religiosus?" Are people essentially, naturally or irresistibly religious? Is it part of our nature to be spiritual beings? Is this what sets us apart from other creatures? And those questions prompt me to ask: if it is indeed the case that people are naturally religious, spiritual beings seeking glimpses of God, and if life always has a sense of transcendence about it, how do we in our churches help people either get in touch, or keep in touch, with this spiritual dimension? At a time in church history when so many churches seem to be on a dumbing down spiral of accessible music, accessible language, simplified images, shorter sermons with Power-Point and an emphasis on human friendliness, this is a pressing question. How do we lift our gaze beyond what's in front of our eyes to catch glimpses of God's glory?

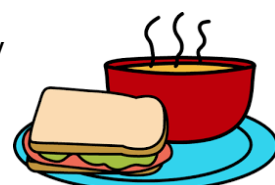

## Revd Mike Dales.....a tribute from Carole Adams

It was in May 1996 that a new era in the life of Sutton Baptist Church began. For in that month the Revd Mike Dales, his wife Gill and the children moved into the Manse and life as our Pastor began. Mike was not particularly looking for a busy town pastorate and definitely did not think he would remain in the same place for nearly 22 years!

These few words will not do justice to the ministry Mike has performed at and for SBC and, indeed, CUCS. SBC has always sought ministers with a strong teaching and preaching focus, and in Mike we have not been disappointed. Indeed his historical and contextual approach to biblical interpretation has enriched many.

Undoubtedly, it has been the creative side of his nature that has encouraged the listener to look for the unexpected in scripture and to listen beyond what they are hearing. He would say that many of his inspirational moments have come whilst browsing the aisles of Morrisons, where he has been spied on a regular basis!

Mike's gift as a wordsmith has inspired many of us across CUCS - a relationship which has been a very important part of his ministry in Sutton; over the years he has been a 'constant' when changes have occurred in both Trinity and St. Nicholas. His passion for ecumenical working has seen him lead services and participate in shared events with our partner churches, which for him was considered a privilege or him as he has gained many friends.

And, it is the friendships which endure. His open, friendly, down to earth manner has made him beloved of many in each of our churches. Where his pastoral gifts have brought comfort to people in dark times, his sense of humour has lifted us all up.

Mike has contributed so much more, and Gill's contribution to working with our young people must not be overlooked. Many lives have been touched by this ministry, in so many different ways.

We will all miss Mike, may God bless him and his family wherever his path takes him.

## CUCS Farewell Service Sunday 21 February



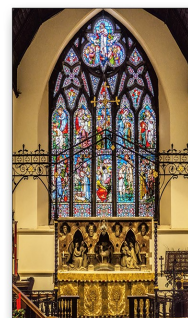
Sutton Baptist Church was packed to the gallery on Sunday 21 January for the CUCS United Service, which fittingly marked the start of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Using the Bunyan Window as a springboard Mike spoke about his personal journey as a Christian pilgrim from his student days to ordination and on through his ministries.

The service was followed by a reception where the current congregations could bid farewell to Mike and Gill and meet old friends again including Revd Sara Goatcher and the Rt Revd Dame Sarah Mullally, former Rectors of St Nicholas. We remembered Mike's varied contributions to CUCS life: Mike as photographer and film buff, charity quizmaster and cyclist and Mike as tour operator leading pilgrims in the footsteps of St Paul. But it is Mike as preacher and pastor that we have valued most, preaching a gospel that challenges us to be open, inclusive and compassionate in response to God's love for us in Jesus.

The three CUCS churches presented Gill with flowers and Mike with a calligraphy by artist Tessa Cooling, the words of the blessing reminding us of his Northern Irish roots. We hope that Carole Adams' photograph of

the sanctuaries at Sutton Baptist Church, St Nicholas and Trinity will be a reminder of his time, not just at SBC, but within the three Churches of Central Sutton.
