

Providing people with clean water and basic sanitation is one of the most **cost-effective** ways to release people from poverty: for every £1 spent on water and sanitation, more than £5 is returned through saved time, increased productivity and reduced health costs.

Community-led total sanitation... It's a bit of a mouthful but it's development-speak for the special approach Toilet Twinning and its partners take. 1 in 3 people across the world don't have somewhere safe to go to the toilet. Bad sanitation is one of the world's biggest killers: it hits women, children, old and sick people hardest. Around half the people in the world have an illness caused by bad sanitation.

Over decades of learning, it's become clear that sanitation projects work best when local people see the need for **improved sanitation** – and make that change happen themselves. We strongly believe that the best way to bring transformation in poor communities is to work with them, rather than doing things for them. It's all about **dignity and self-respect**.

But before latrine-building starts, there's **hygiene education** on practices such as handwashing. This is key to **behaviour change** in the long term. Our partners **involve local people** in deciding on the design and materials to be used in latrine building. This means latrines are both appropriate and affordable. People generally build their own latrine, and this means they are much more likely to continue to use it, and maintain it – ensuring the project is **sustainable**.
